

LEVITICUS

To be read only for a historical insight into the details of burnt offering (Chapters 1-7); rituals in the tabernacle (8-10); ritual purity laws, including Day of Atonement (11-16); The Holiness Code (17-26); ethical laws, calendrical observances, (see #3 below), inducements for obedience, addendum -- tithes and dedications (27).

- 1) 17:7 -- Satyrs, or demons, in Hebrew were wild goats personifying lust to the Jews.
- 2) 20:1-8 -- Molech was an idol or image of a king which involved child sacrifice -- see 2 Kings 16:3, Jer 7:31
- 3) 23 -- Appointed festivals of the Lord: 23:4 – Passover offering. 23:6 – Festival of unleavened bread. 23:10 – First fruits of the harvest. 23:16 – Offering of new grain. 23:27 – Day of atonement. 23:34 – Festival of booths. 23:39 – Festival of the Lord.
- 3) 25:8-17 From "jubile," the Hebrew word for trumpet. See v. 9.
